What do Betty Aragon-Mitotes and Theodosia Grace Ammons have in common?

Both made marks in Fort Collins by advocating for the rights of others, albeit decades apart. In doing so, they established notable legacies.

Ammons was a suffragette and the first female dean at Colorado Agricultural College, which became Colorado State University. She died in 1907.

Aragon-Mitotes is a well-known advocate for the Hispanic community. Her activism includes outspoken support for social justice causes and historic preservation.
